Folks who were interested in forming a Tri-Cities folklife society met for a brunch the next day at the Perrys' and the germination of Three Rivers Folklife Society began. Some of the founding folks were Patty Hessler, Georgia Martin, Jim Honeyman, Mike Cooney and Margaret Valentine, Bret and Cheryl Cannon, John and Micki Perry and Gary Miller. It took another year to have our first concert with Utah Philips, but 3RFS really began 20 years ago. Time flies when you are having fun! Share the fun August 4th!

The 11th Annual Tumbleweed Music Festival is nearly here! As always, it will be held in Richland's Howard Amon Park, and the Richland Community Center. There are 4 outdoor stages, an indoor dance stage, plus an open mic stage. The music at Tumbleweed runs the gamut of acoustic genres, from blues to bluegrass, traditional and contemporary folk, ethnic and nautical, jazz, old-time and alternative. There are also lots of dance groups and participatory dance, a storytelling tent, family-friendly entertainment, local and regional arts and crafts, and food vendors. There are about 100 different acts at the festival, which is free from 11 AM to 7 PM each day. Two evening events, the Saturday evening concert and Sunday evening contra dance, have affordable ticket prices of \$8 general/\$5 seniors and

students.

The Saturday evening concert is at 7:00 PM, emceed by Northwest Public Radio's Inland Folk's host, **Dan Maher**. It features the **Budd Bay Buccaneers**, **Keeler, Melvin and Morse, Cat Loves** Crow, and Creeping Time. The Budd **Bay Buccaneers** are a rowdy pirate band based in Olympia. They combine lively antics and musical talent. Keeler, Melvin & Morse are a trio of musicians from Spokane who play blues and roots music. They have played at Tumbleweed individually and together many times. **Cat Loves Crow** is an acoustic duo from Seattle . Joe and Karena Prater are well loved for their blend of country, folk, and Russian music on guitar and mandolin. Creeping Time is a young, high-energy "grass-rock" band from Seattle, with guitar, mando, fiddle,

drums, and powerful vocals.

Aretrospective on Sunday afternoon and evening will feature performers who have been past festival favorites. Our "déjà vu" performers include The Cutters, Hank Cramer, Michael "Hawkeye" Herman, and local divas **Humphrey**, Hartman and Cameron. Sunday evening will conclude with a contra dance with band **Out of the** Wood and caller Roy Curet in the Richland Community Center from 8-11 PM.

Romagossa Blu, Mary Sisk, So They Say Storytellers, Sultana Dancers and Tri-Cities Drum Circle, Wacka Dooz, Troupe de Soleil, Uncle Joe's Banjo Band, Joe Winters, and Ye Merrie Greenwood Gypsy Dancers and Storytellers. Other performers come from throughout the Northwest and from as far away as Louisiana, California, and Utah.

Tumbleweed is also a participatory experience. The Open Mic stage offers everyone at the festival an opportuni ty to sign up to be a performer. Free workshops provide hands-on learning on all sorts of instruments, dance forms, and peer-sharing on topics of interest. Spontaneous jams occur all over the festival grounds. The popular "band scramble" involves a challenge to perform in a spontaneous band drawn from a hat, with one hour to practice 2 songs or tunes before you perform on stage!

Performers and audience members who have attended Tumbleweed return every year to relive the "déjà vu" experience of community and homegrown acoustic music. Come join the Tumbleweed family and see what the "buzz" is all about.
