

Winter's Return Concert Returns

Saturday, 2 December, 7:30 PM

As daylight disappears and the cold intensifies, it's time to contemplate winter's return. We can all embrace "Winter's Return" with the music of William Pint, Felicia Dale, Tania Opland and Mike Freeman. The concert celebrates winter and all its diverse festivities with voices, guitars, drums, whistles, hammered dulcimer, hurdy-gurdy, recorder, mandolin, violin, and songs that will bring a bright spot to the darkest of winter's day.

Two world touring duos join forces to bring a celebration of winter to our stage. Pint and Dale play music of the sea with consummate skill and high energy, while Opland and Freeman collect music from around the world which they serve up with great wit and verve.

Since 1995 Tania Opland and Mike Freeman have been touring the world together from home bases half a world

apart, with a unique and eclectic mix of songs in several languages and acoustic music played on more instruments than any sane duo would trav el with: hammered dulcimer, guitar, recorders, cittern, violin, hurdy-gurdy, Native American flute, ocarina, and percussion. Their shows feature traditional and contemporary material from many cultures as well as original compositions, all presented with wit and style, and guaranteed to provide an evening of great music and entertainment for all, especially those seeking something a little off the beaten track. Mike's irreverent sense of humor and Tania's stunning vocals provide the springboard for a roller coaster ride across several continents and back again.

William Pint and Felicia Dale have won an ardent following across the United States, Great Britain, Germany, Poland and the Netherlands with their recordings and appearances at festivals and concerts. They gather together material from many locales and cultures including the West Indies, Wales and Brittany. No dead tradition, seafaring music is very much alive in the hands of Pint and Dale, and in the daily lives of people still dedicated to sailing tall ships in the 21st Century.

In a detour from their usual fare, these two remarkable pairs form a powerhouse quartet that makes music like no one else, offering a stunning collection of songs and instrumentals with a seasonal flavor.

This concert will be held in the Community Unitarian Universalist Church, 2819 W. Sylvester St., in Pasco. Tickets are \$14 general admission and \$12 for seniors, students, and 3RFS members, either in advance at The Bookworm and Octopus Garden, or at the door.

Wolf's Wrench - Old & New for Coffeehouse

Friday, 8 December, 7:30 PM

Wolf's Wrench, featuring Mark Reeder and Steve Cary, will perform their original musical "free range fusion," including songs from their self-produced debut album, "Autumn Journey." Longtime friends, these two composer/performers are each known for their unique styles in the Tri-Cities area. They have formed a musical collaboration—composing, recording and performing together—with results that are far more than the sum of the parts. With interests and influences in Folk, Blues, Rock, Spirituals, Jazz, as

well as Mediterranean and Latin, Wolf's Wrench weaves the many into a multidimensional whole of instrumental and vocal music.

Mark "Wolf Man" Reeder's unique style expresses his lifelong musical journey. He grew up to the best sounds of the sixties, while seeing the world thanks to his father's service in the Navy. Before he ever began to play he was soaking in music from other worlds, especially Morocco, where he lived for 2 years. Mark began playing under his older brother's influence—then embarked on the adventure of composing guitar music that sings his

soul, performing both publically and in private house concerts. He has also lent his talents to other acts like Saturn Missile and Romagossa Blú, with whom he often shared the stage.

From early childhood Steve Cary has performed solo, as well as in choirs and bands, in the Pacific Northwest and California. He is from a musical family—his grandfather, Deke Jones, was Jack Benny's trombonist. Steve was originally trained in choral music, and began playing guitar and writing songs around age 14. Coffeehouse, Continued from Page 1 Spanish and in a variety of Latin styles. He has been entertaining Tri-Cities audiences for 20 years, often heard in the popular band Romagossa Blú, for which he was the songwriter and singer/guitarist.

Mark and Steve play a variety of guitars almost as unique as their music. A master of altered tunings, Mark performs in standard six-string tuning, slack key tuning, and a tuning of his own invention. He also plays acoustic baritone guitar, custom made for him by local luthier Duane Noble, who also built Mark's harp guitar. Steve plays 12-string guitar, the South American charango, bass ukulele, harmonica, and sings lead on most vocal songs.

Wolf's Wrench's debut CD, "Autumn Journey," presents the fruits of two lifetimes of musical creations joined together. (More CD's are on the way, including Winter's Edge, a collection of acoustic guitar instrumentals.) We hope you enjoy the journey!

The evening will start with an open mic session. Come early if you want to perform because slots are limited. The coffeehouse is held at All Saints' Episcopal Church, 1312 Kimball Ave. Richland, WA (drive around to the parking lot in the back).
