### **Heidi Muller and Bob Webb**

Saturday, 1 December, 7:30 PM

Heidi Muller and Bob Webb cross the musical boundaries between original songs and traditional tunes, blending each other's influences from the Pacific Northwest to the Appalachian Mountains. Featuring dulcimers, gui tars, mandolin, electric cello, and Muller's crystalline vocals, they have released four duo recordings: Light the Winter's Dark, Up Hurricane Creek, Dulcimer Moon, and Seeing Things. They tour widely to concert halls, festivals and venues such as the Berkeley Dulcimer Gathering, Kentucky Music Week, Tumbleweed Music Festival, the National Oregon Trails Center, the National Music Museum and the NPR live perform ance radio show, Mountain Stage.

Described by Dulcimer Players' News as "one of the dulcimer com munity's best songwriters and per - formers," Muller made her name as a Seattle recording artist in the '80's and '90's. Her song "Good Road" is still heard weekly on Northwest Public Radio and KPBX-Spokane after 25 years as the theme song of the Inland Folk show. Muller was a finalist in the prestigious Kerrville New Folk songwriting competition in 1989. In addition to performing as a song - writer/ guitarist, she taught dulcimer workshops across the Northwest. She went on to tour nationally and recorded five solo CDs before she joined forces with Bob Webb.

Webb settled in West Virginia as part of the 1970's "back-to-the-land" movement. A talented multi-instrumentalist, he toured with the folk-rock group Stark Raven that became the house band for the Mountain Stage radio show. There he backed up many of the greats including Odetta, Arlo Guthrie, Tom Paxton and Shawn

Colvin. Webb also taught music, designing a cardboard box dulcimer that he helped over 700 children and adults make and play in schools and summer camps. He became a recording engineer with his own studio, where he recorded music CDs and helped create documentaries for public radio, including "In Their Own Country" produced by Kate Long. That production was nominated for a Peabody Award.

Muller and Webb started performing and touring together in 2003, based in Charleston, West Virginia. They were included in the West Virginia Artists Roster and worked as artists- inresidence teaching guitar, dulcimer and songwriting in schools and com - munity settings. They also recorded oral histories for events and organiza - tions. Muller collected the local history of Big Ugly Creek, WV and wrote **Continued on Page 2, see Concert**

Talena has taken her time sharing her work. Plagued by major stage fright and deep insecurities, she spent years working on her craft, but rarely sharing it. For 15 years she played guitar and wrote music, studied poet - ry, and even played with a couple local bands. However, privacy and fear took priority over her love for making and sharing music. Finally, she found herself writing songs that compelled her to look deeper into the worth of these fears, and driven by her own music and the numerous artists who had influenced and inspired her, she started performing around Richland. She's now branching out and doing shows around the Pacific Northwest. Ear To The Ground music blog calls Talena "a contemplative"

singer/songwriter with a command of the acoustic guitar. Her lyrics are often poetic and thoughtful." 1/4 cup chopped nuts (your choice)
Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Melt butter or margarine (I use half of each) in a saucepan on top of stove.
When melted, add sugar. Bring to a boil and boil for 3 minutes.

Meanwhile line a rimmed cookie sheet with foil and lay quarters of graham crackers side by side to fill the pan. Crackers break in half easily but to make quarters it is best to saw with a serrated knife.

Finally chop nuts. When butter and sugar mixture has boiled for 3 minutes, pour mixture all over the crackers, then sprinkle on nuts. Place sheet in heated oven for about 5 minutes until bubbly. Take out and cool until they are set up (about 5 minutes.)

Break apart and serve or put in a tin.
