

Heritage Festival at Sacajawea Park

Friday-Sunday, 23-25 September


Mid-Columbia Traditional Arts and Music Association will once again present Heritage Days at Sacajawea State Park. The purpose of Heritage Days is to teach and re-enact the life and skills of the early American explorers, the Native American cultures they found along the way, and lives of the early settlers.

Heritage Days runs Friday through Sunday. Friday is dedicated to school children. Saturday and Sunday the event continues, with Lewis & Clark re-enactors, members of the Umatilla, Yakama, and Wanapum Nations, mountain man encampments, and others who enjoy sharing their skills and lore about what life was like two centuries ago. Traditional music is another popular feature of the festival.

Heritage Days is held at Sacajawea State Park, near Pasco. There is no admission charge, but a \$10 park access fee is charged for these days. 2011 Tumbleweed Music Festival Is Here!

Friday-Sunday, 2-4 September

The 15th Annual Tumbleweed Music Festival will be held in Howard Amon Park in Richland and the Richland Community Center. There are 4 outdoor stages, an indoor dance stage, plus an open mic stage. The music at Tumbleweed runs the gamut of acoustic genres: blues, bluegrass, traditional, contemporary, ethnic, nautical, country, old-time and "alternative." There will be plenty of dancing, from contrat to Cajun to Chinese, and also plenty of regional arts, crafts and food!

This year Tumbleweed has expanded to include a special youth-produced, free Friday night concert. Throughout the weekend there will be nearly 100 different acts you can hear for free. A Saturday evening concert and Sunday night contra dance are the only ticketed events, and they have affordable ticket prices of \$8 general admission/\$5 seniors and teens. Read more

Tumbleweed is a participatory experience. An open mic stage, hosted by our friends at Victory Music, offers anyone at the festival an opportunity to sign up for a performance slot. Free workshops provide hands-on learning for all sorts of instruments and dance forms, and peer sharing on topics of interest like songwriting and promotion. Spontaneous jams occur all over the festival grounds. The popular "band scramble" provides a challenge to perform in a serendipitous band drawn from a hat, with one hour to come up with 2 songs and then perform them on stage!

Tumbleweed Music Festival is a volunteer-run event, funded by donations and grants. Thanks to the hard work and generosity of many, Three Rivers Folklife Society's Tumbleweed Music Festival has been rolling for 15 years! Spread the word.

Tom Lewis Brings Sailing Songs to 3RFS

Saturday, 17 September, 7:30 PM

Tom Lewis, nautical singer, now comfortably located on dry land in British Columbia, Canada, is a 24-year veteran of Her Majesty's Royal Naval diesel submarines. His songs cover a wide range of nautical topics, from life on board H.M. ships, through the loneliness and lure of the sea, to traditional shanties and classic nautical poetry, set to his own, and others' melodies. Tom is the only ex-sailor in North America dealing with the traditions and lore of The Age of Sail, making

them come alive, demonstrating their transition to the present day and explaining their current relevance. Combine this with a warm, "colourful" character and a rich, compelling voice and you have a show full of musical, historical and social significance engaging every attendee, capturing the imagination and interest of children and adults alike.

The Canadian Society for Traditional Music acknowledges Tom as "North America's finest exponent of contemporary nautical songs." Tom's wry humor, button accordion, ukulele, booming voice, and unique experience of more than 40 years bridges the sea-going and folk-singing communities.

Tom Lewis will perform at the Community Unitarian Universalist Church, 2819 W. Sylvester St., in Pasco. Tickets are \$11 general admission/\$9 seniors and students if purchased in advance at Bookworm stores and Octopus' Garden and are \$1 more at the door. 3RFS members receive a \$3 discount

Spokane's Molly and Tenbrooks play energetic and playful bluegrass music. Taking their name from a traditional old-time song, award-winning band members are Kelly Bogan (Tenbrooks) banjo and dobro, Dannie Lynn Plummer (Molly) guitar, Dan Gore, mandolin, and Mark Harding on bass.

Sky in the Road, from Portland, is known for fabulous harmony, awardwinning songwriting, and styles ranging from contemporary to Celtic to Gypsy. Rahmana Wiest plays harmonium and Dan Rhiger plays guitar and bouzouki. They have been playing together for 20 years.

Shanghaied on the Willamette, Portland's favorite nautical duo, performs traditional songs "plundered from land and sea." Jonathan Lay plays guitar and bodhran; Gordy Euler plays banjo and mandola.
