Nothing Small About Small Potatoes! Let's Eat!

Friday, 16 November, 7:30 PM

Small Potatoes, the Chicago-based folk duo of Jacquie Manning and Rich Prezioso, say it has taken them years of "careful indecision" to develop a repertoire they describe as "Celtic to cowboy." Superb musicianship and showmanship, award-winning songwriting, and a strong sense of tradition has made them, as Dirty Linen Magazine said, "one of the most polished, inventive, and entertaining shows on the circuit."

When Small Potatoes performs, you hear two great voices, fine guitar playing, and a touch of tin whistle, mandolin, flute, bodhran, and other percussion toys. Together they present a truly rare blend of vocal and instrumental abilities, award-winning songwriting and arranging talents. They seem at home playing an upbeat cowboy swing

tune or a tender, traditional ballad-- though there are no rules here either, sometimes traditional sounds contemporary, and contemporary sounds traditional. They also pay attention to the little things, like the warmth, the humor and a rapport with the audience that makes for a memorable performance. Some tracks on "Waltz of the Wallflowers," such as Jacquie's one-of-a kind 1998 Kerrville New Folk winning title track, Rich's powerful "1000 Candles, 1000 Cranes," or their Celtic-flavored version of the Jefferson Airplane classic, "Lather" provide a more than ample illustration. Their new live CD, "Small Potatoes Alive!" also showcases their story-telling abilities and their easy manner with their audiences.

Now, if you love potato cuisine as much as acoustic music, you may want to check out The Small Potatoes Cookbook, a book of recipes, stories,

and fun spud facts collected from friends, family, fans and folk music folks. Like their music, this book runs the gamut from the simplest of "Common Taters" to complex and elegant recipes; from the Classic Potato Chip Sandwich to Provençal Potatoes in Parchment; from The Annual Dead Cats and Doily Party, to 13 Ways of Looking at a Potato; from Brúna_ar Kartöflur to Haluschia cuKolompede. With Father Maddon's Very Sinful Potatoes, Rumbledethumps and Kami- kazeHaiku, how can you go wrong?

Jill Cohn, Full-time Talent from Local Roots

Friday, 9 November, 7:30 PM

Songs by Seattle-based singer, songwriter, pianist and guitarist, Jill Cohn, pay homage to artists like Sarah McLachlan, Joni Mitchell, and the Counting Crows. Her tunes range from her own personal reflections to musical contemplations of domestic violence and vanishing rain forests.

Raised here in the Tri-Cities, Jill began singing before she started talking, and music has always been an integral part of her journey. A full-time musician since 1996, Jill has released six critically-acclaimed independent releases. The "Window to the Wise" tour brought

Cohn full circle on many personal fronts. "Seven Year Surrender" takes a deeper look at the actual purpose of why certain situations persist, and how seeking their remedy unfolds a person in new ways.

Jill's performances encompass a wide spectrum of venues and charitable events, ranging from coffee houses in rural towns to her most moving appearance to date, in Seattle's Volunteer Park, where she performed her song "Instead of the Innocent" before 8,000 people. Jill was also an opener for the Girls Room tour, a top-five finalist in the Lilith Fair Talent Search and has opened concerts for many national

artists, including; Jewel, Stacey Earle, Loudon Wainwright III, and Dave Matthews. You may also have heard her songs "Calm" and "Do or Die" on Dawson's Creek. "Calm" and "The Truth" were included on Sony Pictures release, Party of Five, Season 2, DVD.

The Mid-Columbia Traditional Arts and Music Association (MCTAMA) is a local, non-profit service club. Their mission meshes with that of Three Rivers Folklife Society, and we like to support each other. MCTAMA co-hosted the Robin and Linda Williams concert last year, and for several years they have hosted the popular Open Mic stage at our Tumbleweed Music Festival -- Thanks, MCTAMA!

MCTAMA supports all types of art, music, education and cultural events. Right now they have two active sub-groups: one for bluegrass/old-time music and a second for Dutch oven cooking. They sponsor two annual events at Sacajawea State Park: the Sacajawea Bluegrass Festival in June and the Heritage Days celebration in the fall. How they manage to produce two major festivals in the space of three months is a mystery, but they do it well!

MCTAMA hosts a family-oriented acoustic jam on Tuesday evenings at

the Quinault Baptist Church at 5400 W. Canal Drive in Kennewick, near the corner of Edison and Canal. The jams are from 7-9 pm on Tuesdays. All musical genres are OK so long as the instruments are acoustic, though they lean towards bluegrass, old time, and a bit of country.
