Muller and Webb in Concert

Sat. Nov. 15, 2025, 7:30 pm All Saints' Episcopal Church

Heidi Muller and Bob Webb cross the musical boundaries between original songs and traditional tunes, blending each other's influences from Pacific Northwest to Appalachian Mountains. Their songs feature Heidi's crystalline vocals backed by Appalachian dulcimers, guitars, mandolin, and electric cello. They have recorded four albums together, in addition to Heidi's five previous solo CDs. Described as "arguably Seattle's most beloved folk singer/songwriter" in the 1990's by the Heritage Music Review, her song "Good Road" was the theme song of the Inland Folk show on Northwest Public Radio for 30 years. She performed nationwide at venues from coffeehouses to the Kerrville Folk Festival. Her songs "Cassiopeia" and "Sacred Ground" were published in Rise Again, the sequel to the legendary Rise Up Singing songbook. One of her waltzes, "Leaving the Methow," was featured on the Masters of the Mountain Dulcimer, Volume Two recording.

In 2003, Heidi formed a duo with Bob Webb in Charleston, West Bob Virginia. is a instrumentalist who has played the cello and guitar since childhood, and mandolin and mountain dulcimer for over 40 years. He performed with the New Orleans-based bluegrass group Swamp Grass in the last USO tour of Vietnam in 1972. He toured with songwriter Kate Long and played in the band Stark Raven, which became the house band for National Public Radio's Mountain Stage show. There he accompanied artists such as Odetta, Tom Paxton, Shawn Colvin, Bill Staines, Peggy Seeger and Arlo Guthrie.

Bob is also a recording engineer and has produced and engineered several public radio documentaries. Heidi and Bob now live in Joseph, Oregon at the foot of the Wallowa Mountains, where they continue to perform and teach, and host the annual adult music camp, Dulcimer Week in the Wallowas. 

The Paperboys are a globe-touring band that, in a single set, can stomp through Celtic reels, traditional Mexican folk, fiddle tunes, New Orleans brass band music, classic pop songcraft, bluegrass, and even a philosophical waltz or two, before bringing it all home with a Latino/West African singalong. They'll perform in Richland as part of the 2025-2026 season of Community Concerts of the Tri-Cities.

Three shows remain in CCTC's 2025-2026 season: The Paperboys (Nov. 8), Project Convergence (Mar. 7, 2026), and Gentlemen's Quartet (Mar. 23, 2026). A CCTC memberships gets you into all three of the remaining shows for \$50 adult or \$25 youth (under 21). Tickets to individual performances are also available for \$30 adult / \$15 youth.
